Become a member of Pro.Politique

Making political information accessible and helping people form their own judgement.

Pro.Politique is being established as a politically and religiously neutral association for Switzerland. We bring together public data, clear information and digital research tools to support research, journalism, historical inquiry, education and democratic participation.



Why the association is needed

A political question often leads to many different sources: a parliamentary matter, a statistic, a law or a historical document. Bringing these sources together takes time, expertise and suitable tools.

We want to make this work easier. Information should be easy to find, connections understandable and results verifiable against their sources. The public should benefit alongside journalists, historians and other researchers.

What your membership makes possible

You help build independent infrastructure for public knowledge. You contribute your experience, help develop services and support informed discussion of political issues.

OUR SERVICES

Research and knowledge for Switzerland

We are developing our services in stages. Basic functions open to the public are complemented by professional tools. Each service states its scope and availability.

Research across databases

Search and analysis tools make public sources accessible, enabling more efficient and precise research even when relevant information is spread across databases. Direct search uses terms and identifiers. Semantic search is intended to explore connections in meaning and questions in natural language; an MCP interface has been announced.

Journal and political wiki

An online journal, magazine and political wiki make political and historical contexts accessible. Articles supported by sources, dossiers and other media formats help explain information and support independent research.

Politician radar

Profiles supported by sources are intended to clarify public offices, parliamentary activities, voting records and documented interests. Data protection and personality rights set the boundaries.

Democratic participation with INITIQ

The platform provides technical tools for petitions, popular initiatives, referendums, surveys and other lawful forms of participation. The respective organisers are responsible for their demands and content.

Education and digital skills

Planned offerings include training programmes, initial and continuing education, workshops, seminars and e-learning. They teach political and historical knowledge and responsible use of data, artificial intelligence and other technologies.

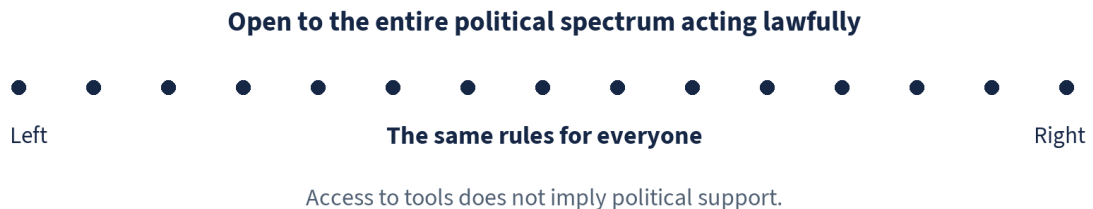
Research and studies

We initiate and commission independent studies on questions of public interest, including with research partners. Topics range from politics and history to economics, health, the environment, technology and social change. Findings are freely available to the public; methods, funding and interests are disclosed.

OUR PRINCIPLES

Politically neutral and open to everyone

Users' political convictions do not determine access. Our tools are open to the entire political spectrum acting lawfully, on objective and uniform terms.



Clear responsibilities

The association provides technical infrastructure without adopting users' political demands. Organisers are responsible for the content of petitions, initiatives, referendums and campaigns. The platform operator's legal obligations remain in place.

Independence in practice

The association does not fund parties, candidates or referendum campaigns. Access, moderation and pricing follow transparent criteria. Factual analysis and political education are part of its purpose; editorial work is guided by sources and facts.

Sources make claims verifiable

Public information needs an identifiable origin. Sources, the currency of data and key methods should be traceable. Facts, interpretation and opinion are kept distinct. AI may support the work; people remain responsible for review and publication.

The benefit remains public

Services are intended for the general public, not just association members. Surpluses are reinvested in research, journalism, historical inquiry, information and education. Profits are not distributed to members.

Making public knowledge accessible together

We are looking for people who want to make public knowledge accessible and help shape the association from the start.

Contribute your perspective

Bring your experience in research, journalism, history, education, technology or organisation. Planned committees will bring specialist work together.

Take an active role or offer support

Active members have voting rights; supporting members contribute without voting rights. The board decides admissions and the general meeting sets dues. The association is being founded. You can register your interest now; formal admission follows its establishment.

A dues waiver through active contribution

The board may waive dues for content creators, developers, network builders and other service providers. Each month they must deliver at least one suitable item of content or an agreed, documented service, under the rules on dues waivers for contributors.

Monthly credit for your research

Members receive a monthly query credit for semantic research in the connected public federal databases. It becomes usable when semantic search is activated; the allowance will be defined in the service offering.
